

In addition to your organisation being fully compliant with all existing Health, Safety and Environmental legal requirements relevant to this supply:

- You must arrive on site with all relevant task specific PPE. You will be given prior notice of any Client expectations
- You must seek out, request and ensure you receive a briefing by the Van Elle Supervisor before entering any
 operational area. Do not enter any exclusion zones that are in place around plant & machinery. if in doubt,
 Ask
- No work shall commence without briefing of personnel concerned on work methods and potential risks involved. All staff arriving on site must have copies of relevant risk assessments / method statements
- Operators must hold a current skill card for the plant or equipment they are operating,
- All plant & equipment must arrive on site free from defect and accompanied by all relevant documentation including operators' manuals, thorough examination certification, etc
- Report any and all incidents, including environmental incidents such as spills or pollution, to help us improve conditions and everyone's safety on site
- You are required to attend any Van Elle or Client H&S briefings, or toolbox talks if requested to do so
- High standards of housekeeping must be maintained
- Anyone attending site must be fit to work. (we need to reference our drug and alcohol policy on our website)
- The use of mobile phones is prohibited in operational areas.
- You must always be stood in a position of safety and ensure that when arriving on site you seek out and understand where the safe zones and routes are.
- A banksman must always be used for all plant movement and vehicle reversing.
- No deliveries outside of the agreed times will be accepted. Deliveries must be offloaded in the designated location
- Anyone delivering to our operational areas (all sites & depots) must also abide by the Loading & Unloading procedures set out below.
- Any supplier delivering to, or working within, must abide by the Yard Rules; a copy of which will be issued by our gateman/security

Loading & Unloading Procedures 1 These Procedures must always be followed

- 1. Driver to find safe location to park near the site such as Motorway services, laybys, industrial estate or similar.
- 2. Contact made with Black Hat Supervisor or onsite Foreman for further instruction.
- 3. Foreman to take control of the instruction from here. Decide when, where and how the wagon will safely enter site to the proposed loading/unloading position. Once the wagon reaches the site entrance the driver will be escorted to the loading/unloading area by the VE foreman or he can delegate this responsibility to a member of his VE team.
- 4. Once wagon arrives at the loading/unloading area the foreman will undertake a driver briefing, and any concerns or comments from the driver will be addressed at this point.
- 5. Driver then prepares trailer for loading or unloading.
- 6. Foreman will then sit the driver in the cab or a position of safety outside the exclusion zone of the work area noted in the RAMs.
- 7. The machine is loaded onto the trailer by the rig driver and banksman, the foreman is responsible for ensuring all non-essential personnel are removed from the exclusion zone.
- 8. Once the machine has been turned off, made safe the foreman will hand over to the driver.
- 9. At this point the load now becomes the responsibility of the driver, it is checked and chained down for transportation.
- 10. Once load is secured the driver is escorted offsite by the VE foreman or he can delegate this responsibility to a member of his VE team.

Under no circumstances is the wagon to be left alone at any point from the site entrance to the site exit.

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
